

2013 CHARLES TYRAND SECRET DES ROCHES C.D.R.
VIGNOBLES CHARLES TYRAND, COTES DU RHONE, FRANCE



THE WINE:

Made from 80% Grenache and 20% Syrah from the village of Rohegude. The vines average 50 years old, and the wine is aged 12-15 months in French oak.

THE ESTATE:

Charles Tyrand is a tiny producer with vineyards in the Cotes du Rhone and Cotes du Rhone Villages appellations. Located near the town of Seguret, they grow classic Southern Rhone red varietals of Syrah, Grenache, Mourvedre, Cinsault and Carignan. The vines are grown without the use of pesticides and range in age from 10 to 80 years old. Total production is below 3,000 cases each year.

TASTING NOTES:

Color: intense garnet

Aromas: strawberry, garrigue spice, and hints of vanilla

Flavor & Texture: ripe red berries and cherries with exotic spices, soft tannins, and ripe fruit create easy drinkability

Food Pairing: slow cooked chicken with herbes de Provence
