

**2015 CHARLES TYRAND ROCHEGUDE COTES DU RHONE VILLAGE**  
**VIGNOBLES CHARLES TYRAND, SOUTHERN RHONE VALLEY, FRANCE**



**THE WINE:**

80% Grenache, 20% Syrah from 40-50 year old vines. Each varietal is fermented separately for 18-20 days with two weeks of maceration on the skins. The wine is aged for twelve months in small French oak barrels.

**THE ESTATE:**

Charles Tyrand is a tiny producer with vineyards in the Cotes du Rhone and Cotes du Rhone Villages appellations. Located near the town of Seguret, they grow classic Southern Rhone red varietals of Syrah, Grenache, Mourvedre, Cinsault and Carignan. The vines are grown without the use of pesticides and range in age from 10 to 80 years old. Total production is below 3,000 cases each year. Winemaker Jean Michel Tyrand oversees the entire production from vineyard to the cellar.

**TASTING NOTES:**

**Color:** dark violet

**Aromas:** deep red fruit and garrigue spices with subtle hints of chocolate

**Flavor & Texture:** ripe strawberry and red plum lead to a velvet mouthfeel

**Food Pairing:** a classic country French coq au vin
